Some of you maybe aware of the comic book series "Asterix", it started way back in 1959 in France and gathered a cult like following in French speaking countries.


It then got translated into an English version somewhere around the 1970's and got an English audience on board. It subsequently got translated into over 70 languages and maintains a seriously big global following today.

It expanded to become "Asterix & Oberlix" somewhere around the 1990's

It has transformed from a comic book into a cartoon series designed for TV, then into Cinema and ultimately to full length feature films.

Asterix & Oberlix have become as well known outside of France as has Citroen and the 2CV

So, it is great to see in the latest Asterix & Oberlix feature movie due for release in France in February 2023, they have incorporated a 2CV Chariot!



Citroens design teams were heavily involved in the design and creation of a concept chariot vehicle that met the needs of this movie. The design team at Citroën were obviously given plenty of licence in this project to create something special that suited the movie's theme plus also had huge appeal.

Given the cult like following of Asterix & Oberlix and its French heritage what better way to consolidate that French patriotism and look to design a 2CV concept chariot for the film. (No doubt the chariot will be pulled by 2 horses!)

We all know how highly regarded the 2CV is held in French culture, but it's the global recognition of the 2CV that will have cemented its place for the movie, plus everyone just smiles when they see a 2CV

The concept chariot is designed with materials that were only available back in Gallic times! Very similar to how people will use anything that is available "at the TIME" during a RAID to keep a 2CV running. (same principle)



REST IN PEACE



Long term ACE member and Citroen lover & enthusiast John Bell passed away in Perth on 28th November 2022, aged just 72.

John moved from Perth to Gladstone Qld a couple of years ago.

John had a 2CV that was severely damaged I think during a hailstorm.

He asked his good friend Renne De Ward to undertake a full restoration of it for him.

I recall seeing the finished product as Renne took it for a run to our May 2022, ACE general meeting that we had a Whiteman Park.

It was such a beautiful restoration and the guys from the motor museum were very interested in putting it on display.

John was recently back in Perth and drove the restored vehicle before shipping it back to Gladstone. He loved it.

Our thoughts and best wishes to Johns family and friends.

I asked Renne if he could give me some background information on John and how he came to do a full restoration on Johns 2CV.

Below is a summary from Renne.....

John Bell, who very recently passed away, was the owner of a red 1984 2CV who got caught in a severe hailstorm in Perth in 2010.

The hailstones went straight through the old canvas roof, knocking him out and the car came to a halt.

Another driver in a very expensive sports car witnessed the whole thing and drove bleeding John to the hospital.

Apart from two broken fingers he was ok.

His insurance wrote off the car and he could keep the car. John drove the car for a little while and then engaged Ralph to do some repairs to the engine while the body went to a restorer in Maddington.

A few years later there was a misunderstanding or a dispute and the work on the body of the car was halted, and the body was then stored in a sea container and the chassis was put on top.

In 2018 John asked me if I was willing to restore the car and rebuild it from scratch.

Up until 2006 I had a workshop in Shelton Park and I used to service John's car. In Europe I had worked on several others, so I was quite familiar with this quirky car.

So then in 2018 I started collecting all the bits and pieces and made a list of all missing parts. I took the body to Stokes and Renk, in O'Connor and they looked at all the panels and decided that they could not do the doors and the bonnet.

They blasted the body and primed it while I took the bonnet, doors and boot cover elsewhere.

At this time John agreed to change the colour to bright yellow, the same colour he had used to restore his Fiat 500 Bambino and his Morgan plus 4. He also owned a Sahara Landcruiser and a Honda NSX as well as a light plane and a much loved and often used yacht.

He had moved to Queensland around 2019.

Meanwhile I engaged a retired old friend to come and help me every Friday morning. Bernie (90) never missed a day and gave me enough work to organise parts. The chassis was professional sandblasted and primed at one of the mining engineering companies in Mandurah. One small spot showed a few tiny holes near the engine carrier which I plated and welded.

We used rust inhibitor right through the chassis box sections and painted the whole lot with brush.

In the meantime, the body and panels had arrived back, and the rebuilding could commence. Ralph Hibble, helped out with a template for the front windscreen, which was then made by a local company and certified.

Tyres were 10 years old but in new and excellent condition. We restored all seats, put a new roof canvas, new brake callipers, discs and brake pads and replaced one noisy wheel bearing at rear.

A lot of work went into the wiring right through the car and I fitted a second fuse box, a battery isolator switch, H4 headlights with hi and low relays and many more new parts.

The engine was cleaned, and I repaired a leaking banjo bolt of the oil feed to the RH cylinder head.

In 2022 I took the car over the pit's, and it passed without problems, the inspector having lots of fun driving it. I could only licence the car in my name while John was based in Gladstone.

John flew to Perth in October and in between hospital visits came to Mandurah to drive his car for the first time since 2010. Sadly, we did not know it would be his last time as well. After 4 operations his body gave up and he died two weeks ago at the house of a friend who looked after him.

During his October visit John arranged for the 2CV to be transported to Gladstone Qld, so he could enjoy it over there, unfortunately time just beat him.

I would like to mention that I have known John since the 1980's when his then red 2CV needed servicing.

But he was always generous and a good friend, full of life.

He offered his yacht as a base for 4 young friends who did the Rottnest island swim, took many people sailing.

He also joined Vocal Evolution, Perth national gold medal barbershop men's chorus and competed with them twice on the international stage in the USA and Canada.

When he was loudly rehearsing while driving the canvas roof did not dampen his voice to the amusement of other motorists.

He was quite a unique character and his many friends, and I will miss him.























Citin Murray Bridge SA is fast approaching so those that have not yet committed and registered, need to do so very soon.


Looks like we have a few ACE people now attending.


