



They love French cars, so take your car and show it off.



Travel in a loose convoy to Corrigin where we stay at Glynis and Brian's. Where they have "plenty of space for campers at our place plus a self contained cottage."



Arrive at Whiteman Park M shelter around 10am so we can have a coffee and get set up.


- General Committee Meeting starting at 11.30 am.

- Entry and exit to the Shelter M, only from Asterix* on map.
- No access or parking to the forecourt of the museum or the grass island.
- Cars must be walked on by someone from the club in a high vis vest (can be supplied at reception at the museum). One of the committee members will take charge of this.
- Vehicles are not permitted to drive down the village mall or drive along the tram line.

Hopefully we have beautiful weather like last time and that it's a great day for a drive, we look forward to seeing as many members as possible get there.














Next year Cit-In will be in Tasmania and there has been a rush of bookings already, I think its going to prove a very popular Cit-In destination.




