- 3) Post the completed form to our post box.
- 4) Bring the completed form to our June Meeting and personally give it to our secretary.

Likewise with a spanner in hand making some running repairs to keep others vehicles going, its all part of the challenge and the fun. Something to talk about around the camp fire during a Raid.






Ralph was destined to have something to do with cars I recon.

A BIT OF HISTORY



15 Things You Didn't Know About Citroën

1) The Traction Avant revolutionised the auto industry in 1934 by being the 1st mass production car.



- 2) Citroen was nearly brought out by GMH in 1918. Deal never proceeded as GMH thought it would over stretch their finances and their management team.
- 3) Citroen used the Eifel Tower as an advertising billboard, from 1925 to 1934. It was lit up with 250,000 light bulbs at night reading Citroen.



4) A Citroen 1923 model 5CV, Torpedo, was the very 1st car to drive around Australia in 1925. (Bubsie) This story and vehicle is very well known to ACE members.



- 5)The Citroen 2CV was the best seller for over 50 years. The car was produced between 1948 to 1990, some 8.8 million were sold.
- 6)The "GT" by Citroen cost \$2.1 million dollars, 6 were sold. It was originally just a concept car on Grand Turismo and they had demand to produce it.



- 7) Citroen went bankrupt twice, first time in 1934 and 2nd time in 1974. Both times Michelin were involved with Citroen.
- 8) Citroen Cars were deemed illegal in USA in 1970. This relates specifically to the luxury SM model and the issue was the unique see around the corner headlight set up that the Yanks could not get their heads around. The other issue was the variable hydraulic suspension. The had a rule about a specific bumper height back then and the SM was too much for them to come to grips with. No doubt this agenda was pushed by the other American manufacturers that were dragging the chain with innovation. Now they have cars fitted with hydraulic pumps that dance up and down, so much for fixed bumper ride height!
- 9) Citroen has made more for China "only" cars than any other auto manufacturer. The Chinese love Citroens.
- 10) The Citroen DS took 3rd place in the Car of the Century competition in 1999.
- 11) Citroen helped create a world record in 2015 of most live music concerts in a 12-hour period.
- 12) The Citroen DS saved the life of the French President, Charles De Gaulle in a 1962 assassination attempt. The tyres on the DS were shot out, however the car with its unique hydraulic suspension could still drive and get the Prez to safety.



- 13) In 2009 the world's top car designers voted the DS the most beautiful car of all time.
- 14) Picasso's granddaughter took Citroen to court after the naming of the Xsara Picasso in 1999.
- 15) 12,000 DS models were sold in just 1 single day at its upcoming release, at the Paris motor show.

FROM THE ARCHIVES



The Westwood 5cv

By Ralph Hibble. April 2005.

After visiting Ron in August last year I e-mailed the Australian National Museum on his behalf. My e-mail follows.

My old friend Ron Westwood is the son of Nevill Westwood who was the first person to drive a car around Australia. He completed the trip in December 1925. Ron owns the car and has preserved much of the history of this unique achievement. I attach a photo of one of about 70 contemporary photographs of the trip. Ron also has diaries, letters and newspaper and other relevant material. He also owns this 80-year-old car which is licensed with the original licence plates still on the car.

He has asked me to contact you with regard to the Museum purchasing the whole collection of memorabilia including the car which



is a 1923 Baby Citroën 5cv, 2 seat boat tail, soft top, four cylinder engine. He has been offered more than \$25,000 by a private collector, but expressed to me his desire, that the car should really be in the National Museum. I promised him that that I would approach the ANM on his behalf. He is physically unwell but really

with it mentally and believes that the right place is a museum, as others do not appreciate the historic value of the collection.

Six months later, after much to do, the car left for Canberra on Monday 21st of February. The photos below show the 5cv being put on a tilt tray truck with Ron very proudly in front of Bubsy.



The 5cv was first loaded onto the tilt tray and from there into the back of the ANM's transport truck which is dust proof.



This photo shows Ron in the centre Al Roberts on the right and myself on the left. From here in front of Ron's house Bubsy was taken to a nearby car park to be put into the transporter.

Ian Cramer and Peter Bucke from the ANM supervised the packing of the boxes of memorabilia and the loading of Bubsy into the transporter.



Here the tilt tray truckie and the transport driver help Peter push Bubsy into the transporter.



The plastic boxes in the foreground contain the collection of memorabilia that went with the car. The museum plans to make a complete display using the many photographs, letters, telegrams and other items that are contemporary with that famous drive around Australia. We returned to Ron's home and as Ron would have it, the success of the venture was duly celebrated, with a cold beer, a roll ya own smoke and general discussion life and all that.

If you are in Canberra be sure to look for Ron's 5cv at the NMA.

I can now tell you of the successful end to my crusade. After more years and dollars than I wish to remember, my Fathers Citroën 5cv has at last been recognised and verified as the first car to be-driven right round Australia. The Citroën 5cv and its history have been verified to the satisfaction of the historians and investigators at the National Museum of Australia. It took them many months to reach the same conclusion that we in the ACE club have always known.

To recognise this fact and to allow all Australians to celebrate my Dad's motoring achievements, the museum proposes to prepare a special area in the Australian National Museum in Canberra. The display will feature the Citroën 5cv and most of the photographs, glass slides, letters, newspaper articles, telegrams and the movie newsreel film from that historic trip.

I wish to thank sincerely, all of you, too many to mention individually, for your hard work and support over the years to keep the Citroën 5cv "Bubsy" on the road. I also thank Paul Blank for his efforts over the last two years to get the Citroën 5cv into a West Australian museum or the Whiteman park Collection.

Unfortunately I am no longer able to participate in most ACE activities, but should a miracle occur and my health improves, I would like again to join in.

I have a power steering unit and kit, new wiring loom, new glass has been cut for all windows.

All upholstery will need to be fitted.

As I am now in my late 60's, it is time to move the project on to someone who is happy enough to finish this off.























RAID CAR FOR SALE




I'm So Old That



Cit-In Tasmania 2024

Dear Club Presidents and Secretaries.

As Chair of the Tasmanian Cit-In committee, I am e-mailing you all to advise that due to events beyond the Tas Cit-In Committee's control, we have had to make the uncomfortable decision to relocate the 2024 Tasmanian Cit-In event.

As you would all be aware, we recently presented the 2024 Tasmanian Cit-In event at Murray Bridge when the event was to be held at St Helens on the East Coast of Tasmania from the 22nd – 25 March 2024.

Fortunately, we have been able to secure a new location at Devonport on the Tasmanian Northwest Coast and have booked the recently opened luxury Accor Novotel, situated on the banks of the scenic Mersey River opposite the East Devonport Spirit Ferry terminal.

The previously advised dates of 22nd -25th of March 2024 will still apply so your members will not need to change your Spirit of Tasmania bookings.

The **Novotel** is centrally located in this small coastal city with the adjacent **Paranaple Centre** also booked to host our Saturday and Sunday evening dining activities and a nearby riverside park providing plenty of areas for a show and shine and relaxing early morning riverside walks to the Bluff lighthouse.

Novotel have reserved 70 rooms in their 180 room, complex starting from \$185.00 for Cit-In registrants. They will shortly provide us with a link which includes a booking code for your members to receive the discounted room rate. (**Do not book Novotel accommodation until the link is provided to ensure the discount applies**).

We also have the Nearby Gateway Motel offering availability of rooms within easy walking distance of the Paranaple function Centre and the Novotel.

Devonport offers a number of attractions, being the centre of Tasmania's Northwest Coast and gateway to the rich agricultural hinterland including Sheffield, Gunn's Plains and Cradle Mountain to the South. Mole Creek, Deloraine and Tamar wine region to the East and Penguin, Burnie, and Table Cape to the West.

We are aware approximately 50+ Cit-In participants have already booked accommodation at St Helens.







The track passes through remote arid deserts and scrub territory of <u>South Australia</u> and <u>Western Australia</u>, which often have summer temperatures approaching 50 °C (122 °F). Sand dunes predominate for most of the track. (Credit Wikipedia)

A Cautionary Tale.

1. From time-to-time Citroens, especially Ds, will suffer a loss of function when coming from reverse gear to first or neutral. This is caused by selector rail "slip". To explain what happens would be too confusing.

However, there is a procedure to adopt to avoid the problem.

When coming from reverse do not flick the lever out of gear. Hold the knob and while maintaining pressure in the direction of the selector,

i.e., against the spring, ease the car out of gear.

If confronted with this problem, the only solution is to remove the transmission cover and realign the selectors.

To my knowledge this has only happened twice in our area when the car way halfway out of the drive and it was raining.....naturally!!

If the car is a D and if it does happen to you or yours, after you have sworn, take the radiator shroud off......throw it in the bush.

It is, after all, another example of Citroen over engineering, and the vehicle will suffer no ill effects and you can then check the transmission oil level more easily, identify leaks and watch the condition of the brake pads......can't you?? now read on...

2. Heard a Citroen person complaining the other day about noisy gear shifting. "Checked the gearbox oil level lately", says I.

"How do you do that?"

As Roy Rene might have said, "Strike me lucky."

(They have only had the car for about five years !!!)

He was nearly 80 years old when he was put on trial (1954) under the Obscene Publications Act, found guilty and fined.

Today the postcards are worth a fortune, here are some examples of that era......

Donald McGill original postcard cartoon artwork.

Donald McGill was a graphic artist whose name has become synonymous with saucy seaside postcards that were sold mostly in small shops in British coastal resorts.

The cards feature an array of attractive young women, fat old ladies, drunken middle-aged men, honeymoon couples and vicars. His work is collected and appreciated for his artistic skill, its power of social observation and earthy sense of humour.

Even at the height of his fame he only earned three guineas a design, but today his original artwork can fetch a great deal of money.

McGill spent virtually the whole of his career creating the distinctive colour washed drawings which were then reproduced as postcards.

His family, however, was steadfastly respectable. He said of his two daughters: "They ran like stags whenever they passed a comic postcard shop".
