

Dear Club Presidents and Secretaries.

As Chair of the Tasmanian Cit-In committee, I am e-mailing you all to advise that due to events beyond the Tas Cit-In Committee's control, we have had to make the uncomfortable decision to relocate the 2024 Tasmanian Cit-In event.

As you would all be aware, we recently presented the 2024 Tasmanian Cit-In event at Murray Bridge when the event was to be held at St Helens on the East Coast of Tasmania from the 22nd – 25 March 2024.

Fortunately, we have been able to secure a new location at Devonport on the Tasmanian Northwest Coast and have booked the recently opened luxury Accor Novotel, situated on the banks of the scenic Mersey River opposite the East Devonport Spirit Ferry terminal.

The previously advised dates of 22nd -25th of March 2024 will still apply so your members will not need to change your Spirit of Tasmania bookings.

The **Novotel** is centrally located in this small coastal city with the adjacent **Paranaple Centre** also booked to host our Saturday and Sunday evening dining activities and a nearby riverside park providing plenty of areas for a show and shine and relaxing early morning riverside walks to the Bluff lighthouse.

Novotel have reserved 70 rooms in their 180 room, complex starting from \$185.00 for Cit-In registrants. They will shortly provide us with a link which includes a booking code for your members to receive the discounted room rate. (**Do not book Novotel accommodation until the link is provided to ensure the discount applies**).

We also have the Nearby Gateway Motel offering availability of rooms within easy walking distance of the Paranaple function Centre and the Novotel.

Devonport offers a number of attractions, being the centre of Tasmania's Northwest Coast and gateway to the rich agricultural hinterland including Sheffield, Gunn's Plains and Cradle Mountain to the South. Mole Creek, Deloraine and Tamar wine region to the East and Penguin, Burnie, and Table Cape to the West.

We are aware approximately 50+ Cit-In participants have already booked accommodation at St Helens.

These bookings are fully refundable, and we encourage people to cancel their bookings at Panorama or other locations in St Helens and when advised rebook in Devonport at either the Novotel, Gateway Motel, or some of the other accommodation venues soon to be suggested with their links uploaded to our new website.



Immerse yourself in Tasmanian art at the Devonport Regional Gallery.



D Special Odometer

For some time I had noticed a discrepancy in the distance travelled according to the tripmeter and the odometer on my D Special. My trips were 5 to 10% longer than the odometer suggested. I put it down to some difference between the drive to each meter, or perhaps something was slipping somewhere.

I became more interested when the odometer ceased to change and the tripmeter continued to roll on. One club member suggested that I had "lost a tooth".

I decided to investigate. A club member offered an old instrument cluster as a source of the potential spare part. This was great as it meant I could dismantle this cluster and identify the fault or faults before taking mine out of the car.

Dismantling was simple enough: slide off the two buttons which zero the tripmeter and allow the emergency warning lights to be checked, remove four Philips head screws to separate the face (black) from the back section (white) and separate the two pieces.

Release the speedometer by undoing two slotted screws at the back of the unit taking care to support the speedo as it was freed from its housing.

It was reasonably easy to see the drive mechanism-a worm gear driving the odometer gear directly as well as the tripmeter mechanism. Both should record the same distance travelled.

I then set about removing the cluster from my car: Disconnecting the speedo cable in the engine bay at the conveniently placed join just above the rocker cover, remove the four Philips head screws at the corners of the cluster, withdraw the cluster enough to get a hand behind it to disconnect the speedo cable and the three multipoint connectors (green, yellow and white).

The cluster was then dismantled as before.

Looking down into the speedo I noticed that the drive gear in mine was not the lack of a tooth but a complete split of the gear


In order to remove the odometer barrel, the speedometer dial had to be removed. First the needle, then the two rounded headed pins, recessed into the face of the dial, which secures it to the frame of the mechanism. About 5 mm of the end of each pin protrudes from the back of the frame. The pins have a coarse thread akin to a decking nail so with a pair of small tapered nose pliers it was possible to undo each pin micron by micron until its head was clear enough of the dial to remove it. Access to one of the pins is obstructed by the extension of the frame which holds the zeroing mechanism of the tripmeter making its removal tedious.

Pin in detail




The odometer barrel is secured at one end by a small strangely shaped spring, one end of which holds the shaft and the other end hooked into a slot in the frame of the speedo unit. Unhooking the spring releases the barrel.

As the gear should be held securely on the shaft it was easier to replace the complete barrel rather than removing the gear from one unit and refitting it to the other.


Care needs to be taken not to damage or distort the series of flat "L" shaped springs behind the barrel.

The horizontal part of the "L" has a triangular face which fits into the notches at the edge of each wheel of the odometer to prevent it from rotating.

Each wheel has ten notches and a tapered flange which after a complete rotation bears on the vertical section of the "L" and releases the wheel allowing the wheel to rotate one notch. If the spring does not engage with a notch, the wheel will continue to turn.

The reading on the replacement barrel can be chosen and set by ensuring the relevant notch engages with the "L" spring.


As in all descriptions, re-assembly is the opposite procedure. (As a pessimist, I cut two 2mm spacers from the insulation of some heavy wire to allow the heads of the pins to sit just above the surface of the dial to make disassembly easier if required in future.)

When putting the two sections of the cluster together take care not to foul the needles of the fuel and temperature gauges. They bend very easily. Before sliding the cluster back into place after connecting the speedo cable to it, check the cable position against the motor to ensure it will move freely and will allow easy connection to the front section of the cable.



A new book has just been published about the Citroën factory in Aulnay-sous-Bois, birthplace of the CX!




Author Julius Goldmann describes the Citroën factory in Aulnaysous-Bois in all its facets:


