

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

Dear Club Presidents and Secretaries.

As Chair of the Tasmanian Cit-In committee, I am e-mailing you all to advise that due to events beyond the Tas Cit-In Committee's control, we have had to make the uncomfortable decision to relocate the 2024 Tasmanian Cit-In event.

As you would all be aware, we recently presented the 2024 Tasmanian Cit-In event at Murray Bridge when the event was to be held at St Helens on the East Coast of Tasmania from the 22nd – 25 March 2024.

Fortunately, we have been able to secure a new location at Devonport on the Tasmanian Northwest Coast and have booked the recently opened luxury Accor Novotel, situated on the banks of the scenic Mersey River opposite the East Devonport Spirit Ferry terminal.

The previously advised dates of 22nd -25th of March 2024 will still apply so your members will not need to change your Spirit of Tasmania bookings.

The **Novotel** is centrally located in this small coastal city with the adjacent **Paranaple Centre** also booked to host our Saturday and Sunday evening dining activities and a nearby riverside park providing plenty of areas for a show and shine and relaxing early morning riverside walks to the Bluff lighthouse.

Novotel have reserved 70 rooms in their 180 room, complex starting from \$185.00 for Cit-In registrants. They will shortly provide us with a link which includes a booking code for your members to receive the discounted room rate. (**Do not book Novotel accommodation until the link is provided to ensure the discount applies**).

We also have the Nearby Gateway Motel offering availability of rooms within easy walking distance of the Paranaple function Centre and the Novotel.

Devonport offers a number of attractions, being the centre of Tasmania's Northwest Coast and gateway to the rich agricultural hinterland including Sheffield, Gunn's Plains and Cradle Mountain to the South. Mole Creek, Deloraine and Tamar wine region to the East and Penguin, Burnie, and Table Cape to the West.

We are aware approximately 50+ Cit-In participants have already booked accommodation at St Helens.

These bookings are fully refundable, and we encourage people to cancel their bookings at Panorama or other locations in St Helens and when advised rebook in Devonport at either the Novotel, Gateway Motel, or some of the other accommodation venues soon to be suggested with their links uploaded to our new website.

To assist us in notifying intending Cit-In attendees, would you please post this information on your various club websites.

We also ask where you have uploaded our previous St Helens brochure, please remove this to avoid further confusion.

We will soon have a new flyer uploaded to our website notifying all details of the relocated 2024 Cit-In event.

Graeme Vaughan will still run the popular Pre Cit-In 8-day tour commencing on the 14th of March and provide an interesting anti-clockwise tour of Tasmania, arriving at Devonport on Friday 22nd March 2024 ready to commence the Cit-In weekend festivities.



Timber Citroen 2CV sells for almost \$340,000, sets new model record

Would you pay Porsche 911 money for a car originally created for French peasants, and made from apple, pear and cherry trees?

The iconic Citroen 2CV divides opinion between those who love it and those hate it.

Those in favour of the quirky French machine argue it liberated the masses in a country which was recovering from the war, while some believe it merely succeeded to meet its brief of replacing the horse-drawn cart by being able to carry two people, a sack of potatoes and casks of alcohol.

However, hopefully everyone can agree that the person who spent a record amount on a <u>Citroen</u> 2CV made of wood is a few twigs short of a full branch.

At a <u>Rouillac</u> auction in Tours, France last week, French museum owner Jean-Paul Favand spent €210,800 – including auction fees – on this timber 2CV.

Converted to Australian currency, that's almost \$340,000 – around the same amount it would cost to buy a new Porsche 911 Carrera S.



The final price is reported to be €40,000 (\$AU64,350) more than the previous price record for a Citroen 2CV, though its understood the most recent record-holder was a more conventional example.

According to the auction listing, work on the wooden 2CV started in 2011 using the chassis of a Dyane and the 602cc engine from a 3CV (an Argentina-only special edition).

The car's creator, cabinetmaker Michel Robillard, spent approximately 5000 hours on its construction, using a mix of cherry, pear and apple trees to create a 2CV-shaped wooden body and interior.



As a nod to the original 2CV – which was produced between 1948 and 1990 – a fabric roof is also fitted to this example.


While it is not able to be road registered – as if you would – its French owner runs 'Musée des arts forains', which translates to fairground arts museum in English.

To date, the 2CV's four-door 'saloon' and van variants remain as Citroen's best-selling vehicle, with more than five million examples sold throughout its 32-year production run.





"MY IMPOSSIBLE DEUX CHEVAUX" or "HOW I TURNED A CITROËN 2 CHEVAUX VAPEUR (2CV/2 Steam Horses) INTO A 4 CHEVAUX VAPEUR (2CV4/4 Steam Horses)"

This is a true story, it really is, asserts its author, architect Dennis Carter. Read on,

We are now a rare few. We the worshippers of the great André Citroën and his invented phenomenon, that most humble automobile with the greatest soul and connector of human souls, the wondrous 'Deux Chevaux', the '2CV'.

I, as a schoolboy, fell in love. Instantly. When looking out of the classroom window one day in a state of, not unusual, somnambulant boredom, this fawn, motorised, perambulator caught my eye. Yesterday it was, only 67 years ago. In class, at the same time every day, my attention was diverted from whatever lesson I was supposed to be undertaking to this small, fawn, metal and fabric, 'snail' that crept up the road.

My obsession grew. Until ... there came one Saturday morning, when ploughing through the pages of 'cars for sale' in 'The Age', I spotted it...

'Citroen 2CV for sale. Excellent...One hundred pounds'.

I asked my Dad if I could borrow Mum's car and 'have a look'. Never had a Hillman Californian travelled so fast from Doncaster to Commonwealth Motors in A'Beckett Street, Melbourne. On arrival at the dealership I raced upstairs and there it was! And I was first there, and said "I'll take it". The salesman said "I'll give you one hour to produce the money".

The Hillman travelled even faster, if that were possible, on the return journey to Doncaster. Fortunately, Dad had one hundred pounds and I drove back to A'Beckett Street, breaking all previous speed records, only to be confronted by a queue of perspiring architecture students..., "a minute to go" said the salesman, as the queue, in recognition of a familiar face, well, dispersed. I had my 2CV. Overjoyed, I drove home to Doncaster, no doubt rather more slowly than my journey in, not only because I was driving a 'tin snail', but also because I was in a dazed dream.

Did I look after it? No, I thrashed it. Around corners flat out, door handles nearly touching the ground. Drive shafts popping out. Once, carrying a passenger just out of prison flat out 'round a corner, he cried out, "fxxk, I'd rather be back behind bars than go 'round a corner with you, let me out!"

I was not kind to that car. But the dear thing took my ill-treatment with a smile.

My friend Terry Fahey and I had camped close by Fred Fry's hut – accommodation for humans and horses - and Helen Schuster's place on the Howqua River. Helen Schuster lived contentedly alone in the Valley for many years providing supplies – vegetables and fruit - and accommodation for those hardy anglers game to venture, one way or another, to this remote location. Further along the Valley groups of fly-fishermen built honourable shacks. King Charles spent some weeks in the Valley at 'Timbertop' the Geelong Grammar school camp site for the 'making of the man'. That was in 1966, a few years after Terry's and my visit.

Terry, dear friend who lived to the end to die from 'Hodgkinson's Disease' in 1966, aged 23.

His, Terry's, or my 2CV had got us into the Valley by skilful manipulation, including the final rough, steep descent, down a dirt track, bouncing and weaving down and down to find ourselves, ever so proud, riverside. We drank beer, moseyed around, caught trout, and played guitar, met hospitable Helen Shuster. Fred was away with horses and riders. We walked in King Charles footsteps, but I don't recall seeing him, though he was possibly nearby in the 'Timbertop' camp of Geelong Grammar, who knows? Until time caught up with us and we had to depart. In short, with me steering and pushing slipping and sliding outside the Deux Chevaux with a brick on the accelerator and with Terry perched in the engine housing with a foot on each of the horizontal cylinders – and a broken engine mounting. But we got out and we got home.

What	а	car!

But that is a diversion.

The real story is this.

As you can gather, we got to know our 2CV's. To the extent that one day I had an idea. At that time, there were two 2CV's, one had an engine capacity of 375 cc and a manual gear box, the next model had a 425 cc engine driving the front wheels via a constant velocity centrifugal clutch – I think that's correct. I liked the manual and I figured that if I could mate the 425 cc engine with the manual gearbox, I would have a most definitely superior 2CV. And so, on the gravelled area behind my house, I removed engine and gear box and engine and centrifugal clutch and got to work.

Not so long after, I started up the 425 cc manual and feeling rather proud, drove into Citro Motors in Smith Street, Fitzroy, to show Bruno Metzer my piece of work.

(Ed.'s note: as older CCCV members will likely recall, Bruno Metzer was the founder, along with Guilio Tombolata, of the business that eventually became Citro Motors).

"Impossible" asserted Bruno. "C'est impossible."

"Drive it" I said.


Bruno did and came back shaking his head. "Impossible, but you have done it".

Telegrams went backward and forwards between Paris and Fitzroy, climaxing with a telegram to Bruno from André Citroën himself. André asserting the impossibility until eventually admitting that I had achieved an engineering feat that no-one anywhere in in whole world had managed.

How did I do it? No idea, but I did and I felt quite proud of myself. And I still do...





Fix a Flat Tire

Automotive tyres became tubeless more than 40 years ago, making it possible to fix a flat tyre while it's still on the vehicle. First, locate the leak. Pump up your flat tyre and spray it with a mixture of 80 percent water and 20 percent dishwashing liquid — it will bubble where the air is leaking. When you've found the spot, mark it with a piece of chalk or white paint marker.

If you have a screw, nail, staple or empty hole in the tread of the tyre, that's a DIY job. Jack up the vehicle and put a safety block under the frame, pull out the screw or nail, then use a plug kit to fix the leak. You'll also need a tube of tyre repair cement to use with the kit.
