- New: Fitting the heat exchangers.
- New: Tool to remove brake system rubber seals.
- New: Corrosion and electrical systems.
- New: Commonly used torque specifications.





Citroën Castlemaime Cultural Cruise

Or Citroën Culture in Castlemaine

10th-12th Feb, 2023

After the taster of Castlemaine we had during the 2022 Heathcote Wine Research Expedition, it was calling out for further exploration. Previously we had seen the architecture of the buildings in the centre of town and visited the museum which gave a taste of the rich gold history that had erupted in the rush of the mid 1800's, and then we had experienced Das Kaffeehaus, so it was actually more a "yelling out" for further exploration!

Finding an interesting route for the Citroën Castlemaine Cultural Cruise was something of a challenge as the town is well served by super highways. But in true Citroën spirit we took on the challenge. The trip to the meeting point was a good omen in that it went very smoothly over the Westgate bridge to GJ Hosken Reserve just south of the junction of the Westgate Freeway and the Western Ring Road. The gods really smiled on us when we seized the opportunity to "drag off" a B Double semi container truck in our 2CV on the climb up the Westgate bridge – feel the power!!!

From the reserve, our crew off west through the industrial suburbs mixing it with seemingly endless trucks and semitrailers. Fortunately, we had good research on the route and so we had plenty of time to dodge traffic. The outer western industrial areas proved to be very revealing as to just how incredibly busy they are. We continued passing into seemingly endless housing estates with a constant buzz of traffic before finally getting clear. We went through farm land over the Toolern Creek and Werribee River and into the north end of the Brisbane Ranges. This proved great driving through sweet, honey smelling bush land on narrow bitumen roads and crushed rock tracks. Real Citroën country!

Coming out the west side we turned north to Ballan for a comfortable picnic lunch under shade. But alas the heat then came in as we pushed north to Castlemaine. It was an interesting drive, but through an uncomfortably hot summer's afternoon.



Arrival at Castlemaine caravan park and air-conditioned cabins gave very welcome respite from the heat. A small recon. Party set out and stocked up on the necessary culinary consumables before collecting the preordered roast chicken dinner. And so after resting, we tucked into a cooked chook, salad with ice cream and extraordinarily yummy chocolate cake dessert for dinner washed with good amounts of wine and conversation in good company.

The cruise was blessed with the participation of several country members from the clubs. These members joined for that part of the cruise enabling their participation but also allowing them to return home at night. It was great to have them along. The prize for the most dedicated such member goes to Kim Windebank who had a friend drive her Pathfinder and caravan to the park for accommodation, so that she could bring Audrey, her delightful plumb and custard Fourgenette – well done Kim!

Saturday brought as slightly cooler day for our cultural exploration. Our cruise team expanded to 30 members with addition of more country members for a car park briefing prior to the morning diggings tour - the gold rush began in July 1851 when shepherds at Specimen Gully a few kilometres north east of Castlemaine found alluvial gold near the surface. Victoria's population expanded almost 7 times over the next 10 years. 5.6million ounces of gold have been extracted from the Castlemaine diggings, equivalent to 159 tonnes of Gold! Using the current day gold price this is valued at \$13.9 billion Australian dollars!



With that our 15 cars set out through the Castlemaine streets quickly leaving town and finding ourselves on corrugated gravel bush tracks in the hilly, pock marked bushland to the east of Castlemaine. Our first stop was the Specimen Gully site where gold was first discovered over 170 years ago. The simple site has a stone cairn memorial and the remains of a stone miner's hut. Looking over the site reminded us that a miner and his family's life was very tough. With the morning warming up we set off again skirting around the edge of the Castlemaine Diggings National Heritage Park skimming past the Calder Freeway and heading back south to Chewton where we visited the Garfield Water Wheel. When constructed it was 70feet in diameter, the largest such water wheel in the southern hemisphere. It was used to power a quartz crushing plant but alas its large diameter made it vulnerable to high winds and so it was somewhat unreliable. Viewing the foundations up close gave an impression of the huge size the wheel must have been. Also looking at the area there were few reminders of the busy crushing plant and surrounding industry there would have been in the late 1800s.

On we pressed south the view the Duke of Cornwall Beam Engine House near Fryerstown. For the time this was a serious financial investment in the engine house and the associated crushing battery and furnaces. Unfortunately the effort was in vain as their was little gold in that area and so the investor's money was lost. The relic of the engine house shows it was beautifully built and is a stark reminder that not all miners were successful.

With our landmark tour complete we returned to Castlemaine for lunch. While there were many unsuccessful miners, some people of the time became quite wealthy as a result of the gold rush. One such person was Ernest Leviny, a Hungarian born silversmith and jewellery who moved to Castlemaine during the gold rush. The Leviny house is a time capsule of life for the gold rush wealthy and was a fitting conclusion to our tour of the diggings. We enjoyed a sit down chicken lunch catered for by the house foundation's caterer.



After our arduous day in the diggings we returned to the caravan park with several folk stopping off at the Mill precinct's Das Kaffeehaus for coffee and cake afternoon tea. During this time our German smallgoods specialty sausages, salad and bread was bought in preparation for the evening meal.





20,000 km DS Crossing of South America

March5,2017



Bernadette and Jacky Chevillon are a couple of young French retirees who are passionate about trips and old vehicles. In the fall of 2016 they united these two passions to make a journey of about 20,000 km in their 1973 DS20 Break through the roads of Latin America. No strangers to travel they had made a trip to Shanghai crossing Europe, Russia, Mongolia and China in the summer of 2013.

The Latin American

journey began almost immediately after Jacky's speech at ICCCR 2016 in Holland in mid-August 2016. There they participated with the DS20 next to the club DS in Provence (an institution to which they belong and in which they actively collaborate). At the end of the international meeting, the DS was taken to the port of Antwerp (Belgium), where a ship would transfer it to the port of Rio de Janeiro, arriving on October 4, 2016.





Meanwhile, Bernadette and Jacky landed at the Rio de Janeiro airport on September 23 and from that moment until the arrival of the DS20, they had to "sacrifice themselves" by waiting on the beautiful beaches of Rio.

As the DS was driven off the boat, a bad maneuver broke the exhaust system. This setback was quickly solved in a workshop in the area and from there the trip was undertaken in the direction of the Iguazú Falls. Day by day the DS20 devoured the miles and they visited different cities and discovered the different cultures, customs and geographies of South America.



A brief incursion into Paraguay they were acquainted with the ruins of the Jesuit missions and, after their passage through Bolivia, discovered the Uyuni Salt Flat, the cities of Potosí and La Paz. Heading north and passing by the edge of Lake Titicaca, they arrived at the mythical Machu Picchu.

Continuing towards the southern end, initially along the Pacific coast, they crossed the Atacama Desert in Chile and then made an incursion through Argentina passing through Dakar: Humahuaca, Salta, Belén, and Mendoza. Passing through the famous Paso de Los Libertadores, they returned to

Chile and visited the regions from Santiago to Puerto Montt.

They returned to Argentina through the Andes, crossing San Carlos de Bariloche and the region of the lakes of Patagonia. Their course continued south to Tierra del Fuego, crossing the Strait of Magellan, seeing Punta Arenas and Ushuaia and celebrating a Latin Christmas there.

From the end of the world, at Atlantic Patagonia, they travelled north through the Valdes Peninsula and arrived in Buenos Aires just in the week of the arrival of the 2017 Dakar.
