### A unique Railton and its fascinating story

This one-off, sporty Railton was completed by Dorothy Shuttleworth after WW2

Largely forgotten now, other than to owners of <u>Invicta</u> and <u>Railton</u> cars, Macklin packed his 60 years with a remarkable range of sporting endeavours, innovative design ideas and varied business ventures.

Born in Perth, Australia, to an Irish family, Macklin arrived in England aged 10 with a love for riding, but little academic drive.

Early distractions included a pet lion, which he kept on a rooftop in Chelsea, and ice hockey played to international level until a smashed knee curtailed his career.

A Malaysian rubber venture made Macklin a fortune, which funded horse-racing, film-making, big-game hunting and motorsport until WW1 changed everything.

Concussed by a bomb blast on the Western Front, he was lucky to survive.

Post-war, Macklin took up ballooning before moving into the motor industry with a sporty light car christened the Silver Hawk. From his Cobham home his interest grew with first Invicta and, after the Depression, Railton.

From 1925, encouraged and funded by his wealthy friend Philip Lyle, Macklin's mission was to produce an automobile that required no gearchanges.



A team of workers were recruited to disentangle and re-erect the marquee. Bob, Dave, and John led the charge and the marquee was quickly standing again albeit with much looser joints and a quite wobbly frame. Copious amounts of gaffer tape and rope were applied to hold the structure together while it was tested in the morning gusts. More gaffer tape and rope, with a step ladder doubling as a supplementary column saw the structure looking a little motley but very serviceable and comfortable protection from the coastal winds and rain.

With the evening event requiring French fancy dress attire, several of the party made their way to the local Op Shop to choose their garments. Others of our raid crew joined Bob in his well set up and comfortable workshop to enjoy his articulate and informative sharing of his technical expertise on "joining metal". The lecture was framed across the range of temperatures involved from cold to very hot in the metal joining process. From adhesives applied cold through to the higher temperatures used to melt and fuse metals in the solder, brazing and welding processes. Bob's lecture included welding demonstrations including MIG and electrode arc welding machines and even 2 series wired 12 volt car batteries used to create an arc weld using an electric arc welding rod! Bob's colourful delivery kept the audience quietly engaged.




